

The emollient "feel" of the solution was impressive! We really enjoyed the usage of the machine and the apparent increased cleanliness of the "no hands," touchless dispensing. That was especially appreciated by our female staff members, and one of them remarked that one could virtually pay for the unit by the savings of paper towels needed to dry the hands with conventional washing. In addition, Soaptronic's bactericidal agent, isopropyl alcohol, has a broader spectrum, and does not promote resistance to antibiotics, a growing problem with organisms today, i.e. staph.

Again, I would like to thank you and your exceptionally fine consultant, Bill Kimbrell, for his thorough explanation of the unit and the disinfection process. If there were one thing I would change, it would be to alter the name so users would not wrongly assume they were applying soap to the hands which always needed to be washed off.
